Privacy Issues & Protections - It is a Big Deal (.15 CEU)

The Internet and national security concerns have brought about the capability

of personal information becoming a commodity to be gathered, packaged, marketed, or used for investigative purposes unknowingly or without active participation of the information subject. New technology for gathering and disseminating individual personal information has surpassed both government regulation and new technologies to effectively regulate these activities. We will review the current law and policy issues in the gathering and use of personal information and the protection of privacy and how they relate to privacy and public records, privacy of health and genetic information, database development, and privacy and law enforcement and what this means for the court reporter regarding data storage and record retention. We will do an overview of privacy-related legislation including the USA PATRIOT Act, HIPAA, and current legislation on the horizon. Stenographers are still truly guardians of the record in ways we had never envisioned.
