Eighth Annual MAPCR Realtime/Speed Contest

(up to .25 PDC possible)

There are two legs that are required: A 200 wpm, five-minute literary take, and a 280 wpm, two-voice testimony take. You must pass with a score of 96 percent or better to get credit. We are offering the first leg of five minutes of literary dictation at 200 wpm. If passed, it will be applied as a credit for your Realtime Contest with NCRA. You will still need to pass the other leg at another time. On Friday afternoon, it will be live dictation. You will need to turn in a flash drive with the test on it so it can be printed out and corrected. Any writer of shorthand who is a member of MAPCR in good standing for the preceding two years is eligible to compete. Please register on the convention registration form. Per NCRA, qualifiers are eligible to receive 0.25 PDC per leg. An individual may only receive a maximum of 1.0 PDC per three-year NCRA cycle.

Other contest rules and regulations will be provided at the convention. The fee is \$25 and must be paid by the registration deadline. There will be no onsite registration.
